Mr. Diggs' leadership spearheading *pro bono* projects designed to aid low-income Washingtonians was critical to the development and success of Washington Appleseed in our region. This recognition allows the Foundation to simultaneously pay tribute to lawyers who perform public service to provide meaningful access to our civil justice system to low-income people in different ways.

The Goldmark Award honors the memory of Charles A. Goldmark, a Seattle attorney, community leader and ardent supporter of access to justice. Mr. Goldmark served as the Legal Foundation's president at the time of the tragic assault that led to his death in 1986.
