This message has been sent on the behalf of the BJA Court Security Task Force to the listservs for the BJA, the judges and administrators in Superior, District, and Municipal courts, Juvenile Court administrators, and the County Clerks.

Help Support Funding for Court Security

The Board for Judicial Administration (BJA) and Court Security Task Force need your support to advocate for court security funding. Now, more than ever, all Washington Courts need the resources to meet minimum security standards as we face increased challenges to public and court employee safety.

The Administrative Office of the Courts 2023-2025 budget includes a request of \$2.5 million annually to establish the Security Matching Grant Program. This program will fund up to 90% of the costs for security equipment and private security staff for small and rural courts in economically distressed jurisdictions. Local governments will contribute a small variable percentage of the costs to secure their local courthouses. We are asking everyone to reach out to the state legislators in your own district and to the funding and justice related committees to ask them to support the courts that need this assistance in order to secure their courthouses



I am writing to you as a (Judge/Justice Partner) incounty/city.
So many small and rural courthouses in economically distressed parts of Washington State do not meet basic security standards. State funding is needed to close the gap between what local governments can afford with their very limited revenue and small tax bases to ensure the safety of their courthouses in their communities.
Adequate security is particularly significant during these challenging times of heightened threats to the security of government buildings. Courthouses are the hub of civic life where disputes are resolved by the rule of law. Court proceedings can be emotional events and courts are reporting an increase in security disturbances and serious threats to judicial officers and court employees.
Please support this funding request to create the Small and Rural Courthouse Matching Grant Program so that courts in lower-resourced jurisdictions can hire private court security staff and purchase equipment for weapon screening, security cameras, duress alarms, and emergency notification systems that address the unique security needs of each courthouse. This funding of \$2.5 million annually will give local courts and governments the resources to improve public safety in their courthouses.
We appreciate your attention to this crucial need to protect public safety in courthouses. Full funding of this request will help provide equitable and safe court access to community members across the state.

2023 Funding Request for the Security Grant Matching Program Frequently Asked Questions

1. Are there security risks at small, rural courts? Why invest in security equipment and/or staffing for them?

- Rural courts have not been immune to acts of violence. Yes, security is expensive, but inadequate security may be even more expensive. Lawsuits can cost several times more than adequately funding a secure courthouse. Human costs in terms of devastation to members of families, communities, and courts matter too.
- Risk analyst reports indicate that several small rural courthouses need security upgrades to comply with GR 36 minimum standards and have little or no security to help deter any threat/attack on the court or citizens.
- Over 10% of security incidents reported to the Administrative Office of the Courts have occurred in fifteen rural courthouses that house both a Superior and District Court and have little to no entry screening or adequate security equipment.

2. Why aren't local governments able to fund security equipment and staff?

- Many local jurisdictions don't have adequate revenue streams to support security enhancements at courthouses. The state historically funds certain initiatives within courthouses (Becca funding, interpreter funding, drug courts, therapeutic courts, early learning courts, etc.), and the state has the capacity to fill this critical gap in courthouse security across the state to ensure that anyone seeking justice is safe when doing so.
- This matching grant program includes a cost sharing component so that small and rural courts in economically distressed jurisdiction contribute a small percentage to the costs of courthouse security. The local share will range from 10-50%; the higher the level of economic distress, the lower the contribution.
- Funding priorities of local governments in small, rural counties focus on the ability to maintain critical services such as law enforcement which typically accounts for a significant portion of the government's general expenses.
- Many rural counties in Washington have lower assessed property values, much lower median household incomes, and limited abilities to create a revenue source to undertake security at their courthouse.
- Many rural small rural communities are having to address increasing demands on services associated with mental health and homelessness in areas already seeing significant numbers of unemployment and people living in poverty.

3. Why does the State legislature have a role in the safety of courthouses?

■ These funds protect the safety of all people who enter Washington State Courts. The state has an obligation to ensure that those individuals seeking justice and those individuals working with and for our court system have a reasonable expectation of security and to preserve Washingtonians' access to our judicial system.

- The courts requesting funding are administering justice according to Washington State laws.
- Providing a safe and secure courthouse for jurors, victims, and witnesses is instrumental to providing proper due process for all. Court security protects not just individuals; proper court security is protecting the judicial process for all citizens in Washington.

4. Will this budget request provide security funding for to all courts?

- Only small and rural courts that are located in economically distressed jurisdictions are eligible for funding and a proportional contribution from local governments ranging from 10-50% is required. Contribution proportions are based on the revenue base, median income, and poverty rate of the jurisdiction.
- Funding will be allocated first to the needlest locations that have not received prior funding, with the goal of addressing every court's needs over time.

SECURITY FUNDING IS NEEDED FOR PUBLIC SAFETY IN WASHINGTON COURTHOUSES

The Washington Judiciary is requesting \$2.5 M in ongoing annual funding for security personnel and equipment for small and rural courts that do not meet <u>General Rule 36</u> minimum standards for court security.

All Individuals Need To Feel Safe When Accessing Courts
A recent assessment of courts' security measures found that

A recent assessment of courts' security measures found that over one-third of courthouses lack the basic security equipment necessary to protect citizens coming into courthouses in their communities. Many more courts have gaps in their security that need to be addressed. Court users, witnesses, and jurors must feel safe while accessing justice.

Personnel, Entry Screening, & Security Equipment Are Lacking

The presence of security personnel is needed to ensure the safety of courthouses. Preventing dangerous items from entering the premises is fundamental to adequate security. Funding for personnel, entry screening, and other security technology that are vital to responding to security incidents is especially challenging for smaller courts that often do not have adequate technology.

Training Is Fundamental To Courthouse Security

Ongoing staff safety training is key to developing adequate and competent responses to security incidents. Courts have requested additional training be provided so staff can be prepared to respond to situations to keep court users safe.

Small and Rural Court Security Matching Program

Courts will have the option to access security funding by contributing a small percentage of the overall cost and making existing taxpayer dollars go further by sharing the cost with the State. Shared cost is determined by need factors such as poverty rate, median income, and revenue.

Establish the Rural and Small Court Security Matching Grant Program

1. The judicial branch is requesting \$2.5 million annually to create a matching grant program to serve small and rural courthouses in economically distressed jurisdictions. This program includes a local government cost sharing component.

State funding will cover between 50 - 90% of the costs for security equipment and staffing, with local governments contributing 10 - 50%. Courts located in the needlest jurisdictions contribute the lowest percentage of the cost.

Factors used to determine the economic health of a jurisdiction are: poverty rates, median income and revenue.

For instance, a courthouse located in a county with a low revenue base, low median income and high poverty rate, will contribute 10% of the total cost.

- 2. We know legislators share our concern for everyone to feel safe in our public buildings. This funding request will give courts and their local funding entities the financial support that they need to make these types of critical security upgrades:
 - Hire private court security officers to keep people safe and prevent security incidents
 - Contract for onsite and on demand security training for all courthouse employees
 - Purchase entry screening equipment and construct entry screening stations
 - Purchase and install security cameras and duress alarm systems

Prevention and Response: The need for court security officers and security equipment

Rural courts are especially vulnerable in the case of a serious security incident. Even if they are
housed with law enforcement, responding officers are often patrolling other parts of the
jurisdiction. Reliable duress alarms and emergency broadcast systems are critically needed for
these courts.

- 4. Court security officers and entry screeners are vital tools to keep weapons out of the court, deescalate disruptions, and remove dangerous people from the courtroom. All courts in Washington, regardless of rural or urban location, handle cases that have significant effect on people's lives and evoke emotional responses that can create safety risks and the need for court security staff.
- 5. Courthouse security equipment is essential to prevent and respond to security incidents. There are approximately 100 courthouses in the state that have either outdated or no security equipment.
 - Security cameras and duress and broadcast alarm systems are necessary in order to react quickly to security emergencies.
 - Weapons screening with magnetometers, wands, and x-ray machines will keep dangerous items from making it into the courthouse.
- 6. Security audits form the foundation of a good security plan and are recommended every three years. Over 75% of courts do not meet this recommendation, with many never having had an audit. This funding will provide courts with experienced security experts to assess security risks, advise on steps to resolve critical vulnerabilities, and prioritize security improvements.
- 7. Courthouse personnel need access to active shooter and de-escalation training. Funding will provide resources to provide training for judicial officers and members of the court community in order to prevent or react safely to security incidents and acts of violence.

Security Incidents and Increasing Threats

- 8. One hundred seventeen victim advocates surveyed in 2020 said they are concerned for their safety and the safety of their clients in courthouses across the state. Over 60% of advocates have experienced one or more security incidents that range from harassment and threats to physical assaults on courthouse premises. Over 75% of advocates said that their client expressed concerns about personal safety in the courthouse.
- 9. Even though courts were either closed or open on a limited basis, courts are reporting more serious threats and disturbances in the courtroom over the past two years. The 546 incidents reported since the beginning of 2020 continue the upward trend in all security incidents that have been reported to the Administrative Office of the Courts since 2013.
- 10. The Department of Homeland Security continues to publish national terrorism bulletins warning of the heightened threat of violent extremism and potential attacks. Additionally, The U.S. Marshals have indicated for years that they expect continued increases in threats to judges. As courthouses are a symbol of justice and the hub of civic activities, the need to fortify the security of these buildings has never been greater. Now is the time to provide the resources so that all courts meet the minimum security standards to protect all who enter courthouses in Washington State.
