Administrative Law

The **Administrative Law Section** is designed to serve the interests of public and private sector attorneys who work with state and local regulatory agencies to improve and facilitate the administration of justice in administrative law. Members include assistant attorneys general, city attorneys (on private contract as well as public employees), county prosecutors who work on regulatory matters, and private practitioners who either contract to represent government entities or who represent clients subject to government regulation.

HIGHLIGHTS OF THE YEAR

- Produced three Mini-CLEs on the following topics: Computer Fraud and Abuse Act, Teacher Discrimination & Strict Liability, and IDEA/Special Education Issues in an Administrative Practice.
- Authorized the Legislative Committee to send the Attorney General's Office (AGO) an expression of interest in the AGO's announced review of certain model Public Records Act (PRA) rules in response to a petition submitted by various media groups.

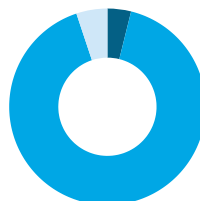
