⊠Yes □No The Disciplinary Advisory Round Table (DART) acts as a forum for the discussion of issues affecting the discipline system for licensed legal professionals in Washington state. DART provides an annual report to the Washington Supreme Court and the WSBA Board of Governors, including any recommendations for change and the identification of concerns or issues.

Position overview: DART members meet on an ad hoc basis to review, discuss, and provide comment on issues that concern the discipline system.

Appointment is for a 3-year term beginning October 2025 and is eligible for reappointment to one additional term.

Benefits: Members will learn about the lawyer discipline system and process and the development of discipline systems for other licensed legal professionals in Washington state.

Time commitment: DART holds one to two-hour meetings on an ad hoc basis. Meetings are primarily held remotely.
