The Practice of Law Board was created by the Supreme Court and is administered by the WSBA. GR 25 outlines the Board's responsibilities, which include to (1) educate the public about how to receive competent legal assistance; (2) recommend new avenues for persons not currently authorized to practice law to provide legal and law-related services; and (3) receive and refer complaints that allege the unauthorized practice of law. The Board participates in the administration of the Washington pilot project for entity regulation which authorizes entity to practice law as part of an innovative long-term study on regulatory reform.

Position overview: Members attend monthly meetings and actively contribute to the Board's ongoing work. Appointment is for a three-year term with eligibility to be reappointed for one additional three-year term.

Benefits:

- Participating in work that might create something new
- Learning about ways other jurisdictions are working to address these same issues
- Interacting with a dynamic, diverse group of people who "think outside the box"

Time commitment: Members are expected to attend monthly meetings for approximately 2 hours. The Board meets remotely with two in-person/remote hybrid meetings held at the WSBA offices in downtown Seattle. The Board meets annually with the Supreme Court during a hybrid meeting held at the Temple of Justice in Olympia.

Requirements: Applicants can be active, judicial, inactive, emeritus, or pro bono WSBA members or members of the public.

Preferred qualifications and skills:

- Interest in access to justice and public education
- Interest in innovation
- Interest in working on collaborative, long-term projects

Selection and appointment process: Candidates are vetted by the Board. Nominations are provided to the WSBA Board of Governors for its information, and the Supreme Court makes the appointments.
