Hon. Ronald Kessler (ret.) Receives Outstanding Judge Award

Seattle/King County judge recognized for decades of service on the bench for the people of Washington

SEATTLE, WA [Sept. 29, 2017] – The Washington State Bar Association (WSBA) presented the Hon. Ronald Kessler (ret.) with the 2017 APEX Award for Outstanding Judge. This award is presented for outstanding service to the bench and for special contribution to the legal profession at any level of the court. WSBA President Brad Furlong presented the award at the WSBA Annual APEX (Acknowledging Professional Excellence) Awards Dinner on Sept. 28 at the Sheraton Seattle.

Judge Kessler served on the bench for the people of Seattle and King County for more than 30 years. In 1985, he began his service with the Seattle Municipal Court before moving to the King County Superior Court. Prior to being on the bench, he worked as a public defender for 10 years, where he handled a full spectrum of cases from misdemeanors to serious crimes, and served both as a felony and misdemeanor supervisor.

His prior experience as a public defender served him well. Over his career, he mentored many young attorneys and trained lawyers in trial skills and advocacy. His lectures on court rules and criminal law, as well as his *Criminal Caselaw Notebook*, have been invaluable resources for all new Washington judges.
